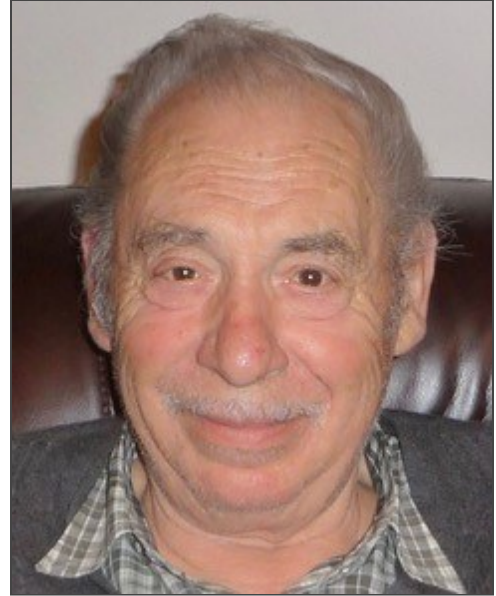


Jack Aramini

In addition to his mastery of carpentry and pride in his work, Jack had many talents and interests. From wine and sausage making, to gardening, to hunting and fishing he excelled. Above all, Jack was a devoted spouse, father, Nonno, and friend. He spoke proudly of his children and grandchildren and relished dinners and famous parties with his many friends.
