It is with great sadness that we announce the death of our beloved father/Boppa, Dave Bailey. Dad passed away peacefully in his sleep in the hospital in Calgary, Alberta on Tuesday, May 16, 2017.



David was the son of James (Herb) Albert Bailey and Gladys Maud Jackson in Cornwall, ON. After graduating from Queens University with his Engineering degree, Dad moved to Montreal for work, where he met and married our mother, Elizabeth (Betty) Mary Kiss. They were married for ten years before separating. Dad's world revolved around his daughters, and when Lydia moved to Alberta in 1989, he followed her to be near her and his grandchildren.
