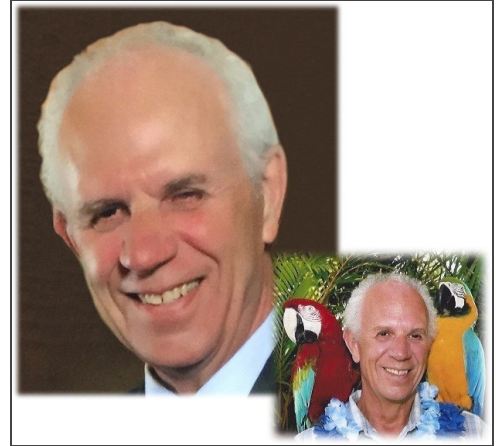


Terrence Robert Baker
