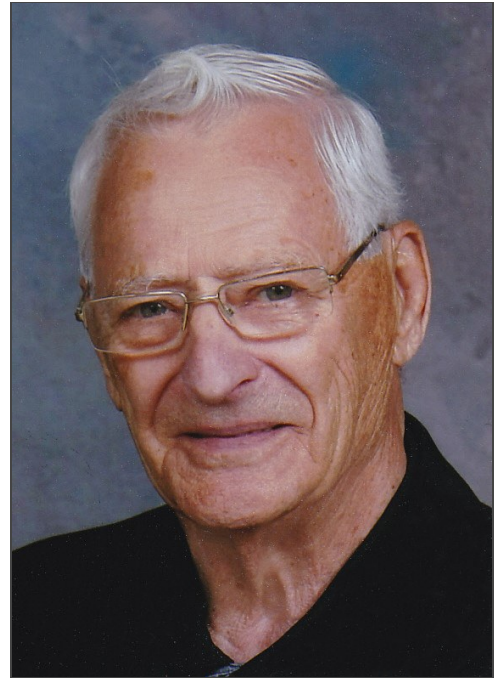


Gilles Belliveau
