

# Wilfrid Bertrand

His home on 10th Ave had a garden that would wow any and all that saw it. Lots of parties and fun was had in the house on 10th Ave East. Then in 2008 with his ageing and health deteriorating he moved into Queen Victoria Estates Independent living and two moves later, he called William Booth his home until his passing.
