Beverly Lynn Anderson (1947 - 2025) Beverly, age 77, of White Rock, BC, died peacefully at home on Thursday, Aug 21, 2025, after a 3-year battle with ALS.

She was born in Vancouver on Dec 11, 1947 to Walter and Margaret Bennett as the third of four children, and the favorite/only daughter.

The following summer (1948) Beverly and her family moved to Edmonton, Alberta, where Bev enjoyed growing up with her cousins and extended family nearby, summers at the lake, and the gifts of vibrant Christian community. After a year at Bible College, 3 years at the UofA, and a whirlwind courtship, Beverly married Keith Anderson on May 26, 1973, and together they enjoyed raising two sons, Jonathan and Scott. They enjoyed seasons of life in Lethbridge, Calgary (twice), Victoria, and in 1986, settled as a family to White Rock, BC and remained there for the rest of Bev's life.

Bev was known for her endless creativity, warm hospitality, good book recommendations, thoughtful encouragement, playfulness and down-to-earthiness. All of which was undergirded by a steady and sincere devotion to Christ.
