Sylvia passed away on Monday, April 25, 2022 at the Peter Lougheed Hospital after a lengthy illness.

She completed her High School at Mount Royal College and went on to become the President of the first Foothills Hospital Nursing Class. Over the years she worked in several nursing specialties. A four year adventure to beautiful New Zealand found her helping with sheep shearing, waitressing, picking apples, nursing as well as exploring.
