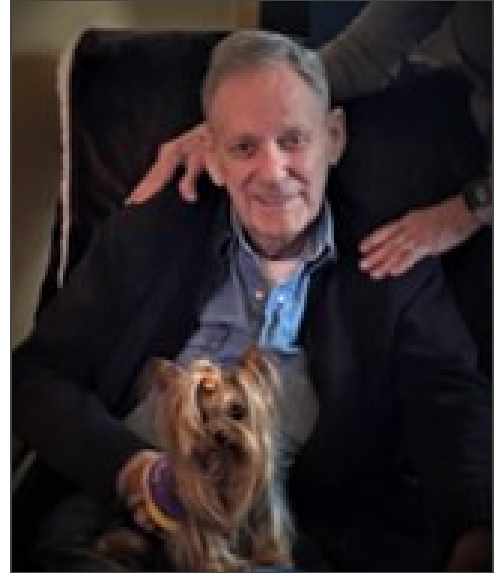


# William Arthur Braaten
