children. She was a gentle and loving person, empathetic and always genuinely interested in the happiness and well-being of the people around her. She was an avid reader, and often informed herself about history, politics and current events. In her just over 90 years of life she saw many changes in the world. She was not afraid to ask questions and keep abreast of those changes. She had a strong sense of right and wrong without being overly judgmental, as it was always in her heart to try to understand the struggles of people in hard circumstances.

May was a delight to all who knew her, she was loved and respected and will be greatly missed by all who knew her.
