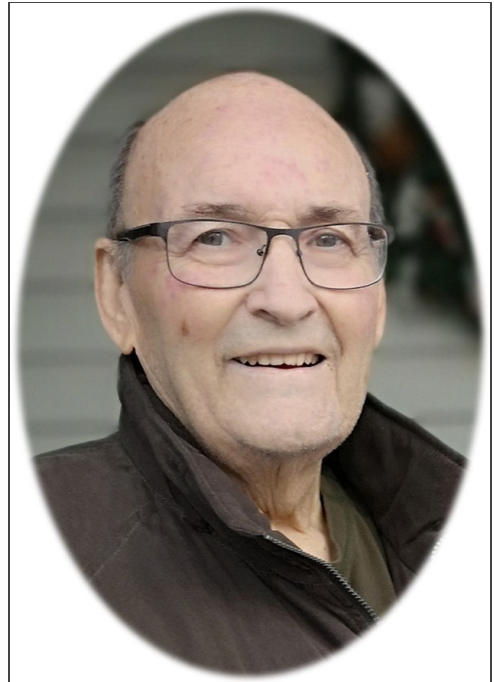


Harrison Morton Jr. Caufield
