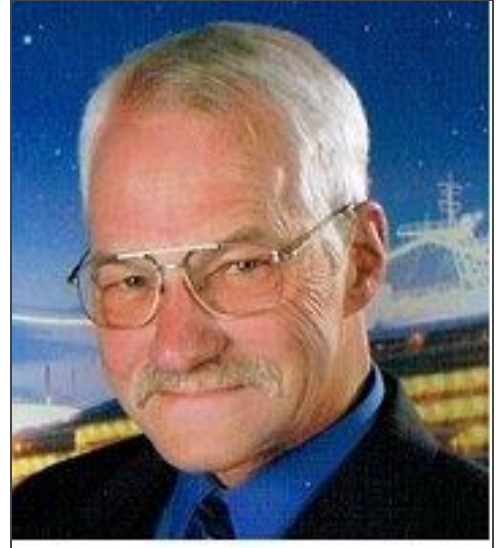


# Gary Clark Center
