With his family by his side, Dad passed away peacefully on Saturday, September 23, 2017.

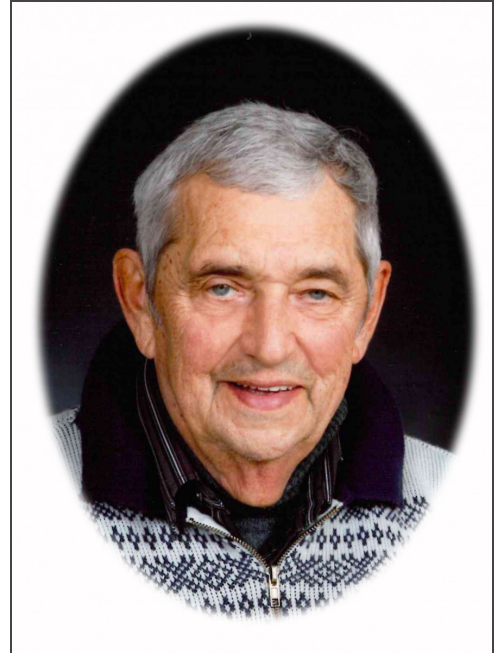
