On the evening of September 8, 2020, the family and friends of Giorgio Rino DeGianni lost a vibrant and generous man.

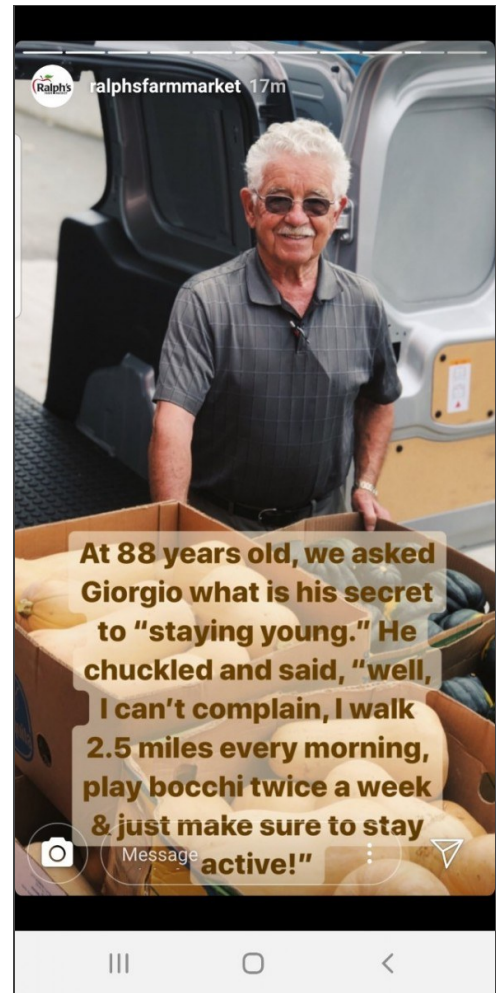
