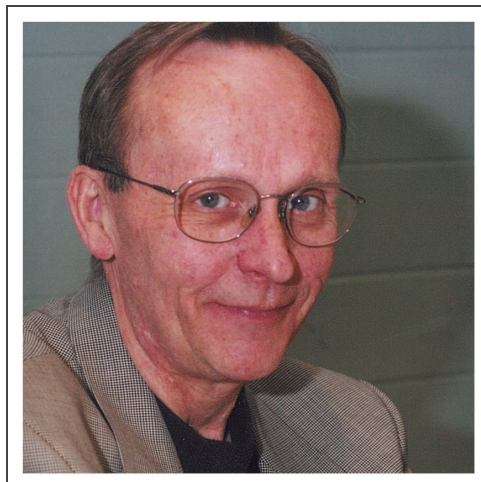


John "Jack" Leslie Doerr
