Anthony Emile Dubitski was born March 21, 1956 In Edmonton, Alberta. He was one of seven children born to Edward and Kathleen Dubitski. In Tony's early years he was especially close to his maternal grandmother Alice Dolorne. The love and adoration he held for his grandma Alice was felt immensely in the stories he told and shared throughout the years.

After his father's passing, at the age of nine, Tony went to live with Don and Loretta Carruthers's family. To Tony they were his Uncle and Aunty. The Carruthers's family were loving and very much influential in shaping the person Tony chose to become.
