

# Paul Armand Dufault

Paul Armand Dufault entered the presence of Jesus at age 38. His sudden death was caused by breathing problems, likely related to his asthma which he struggled with since his early childhood. While Paul lived most of his life in Calgary, his main life-work and passion for the hospitality industry took him to Vancouver British Columbia, Banff Alberta and on cruise ships in the Caribbean. He traveled across Canada working for a time in the printing industry. Paul had an engaging, competitive and animated personality and expressed interest in a wide range of topics. These covered sports of all types, national and international politics, stand-up comedy, movies, and cooking. Most importantly, he was a fantastic dad and passed on his love for soccer to his son Maxwell. Together they surfed the internet studying dinosaurs, animals, snakes, sea creatures, and even well-known political figures. Paul had a strong creative bent when it came to organizing games for the neighbourhood children, preparing sumptuous dishes, describing wines, and mixing his special sauces. He jumped at the opportunity to cook or BBQ for his family and friends. He had a remarkable memory for interesting facts and statistics, and valued his many long-term relationships. The impact he had on all his friends and family will be lasting and deeply missed. Paul is lovingly remembered by his partner Mariella McMahon, their son Maxwell aged 4, as well as by his parents Amay and Donald Dufault, sister Tania Dufault and her family Trevor McIvor, Madeleine McIvor and Gregor McIvor, and by Maxwell's grandparents John and Joka McMahon and their children Peter (Jen) and Ian.
