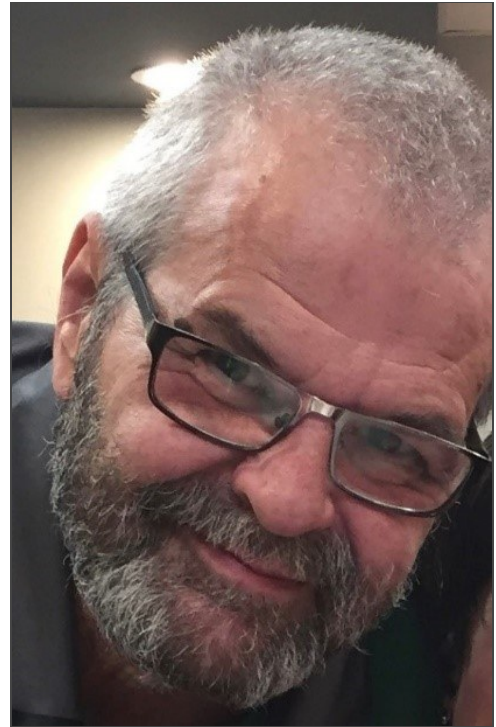
With deep sadness, the family announces the passing of Frank Dyck, at the age of 66, after a short battle with cancer.
