Ed and Luce opened their home to many foster children.

He was a devout Catholic who was heavily involved in the community, volunteering his time through the church, a Chamberlain town Councillor and was always willing to help someone in need. His children, grandchildren, and friends always knew that help was only a holler away.

He taught us kindness, patience and how to select a good hamper. He would test all the baked goods, especially pies, by having a piece first just to make sure they were “safe enough for us to eat”. He was honest, fiercely loyal and valued integrity over everything. He walked at a fast pace, taking large strides and has left some very large shoes to fill.
