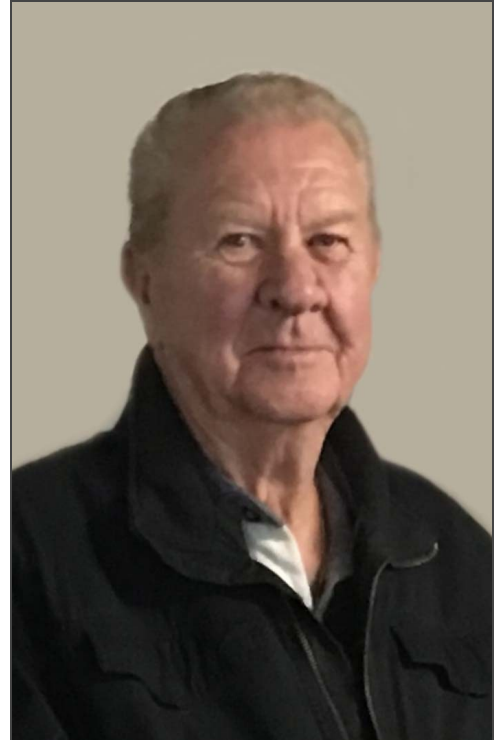


Frank Pius Eiswerth
