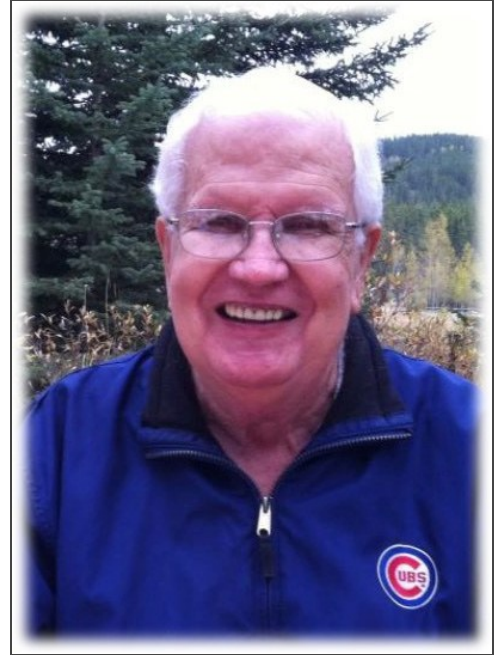


# Adam Neil Ellison
