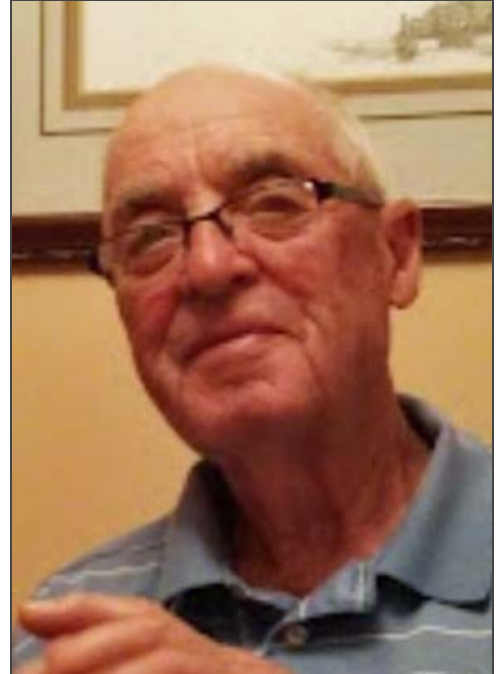


# Lloyd Henry Engel
