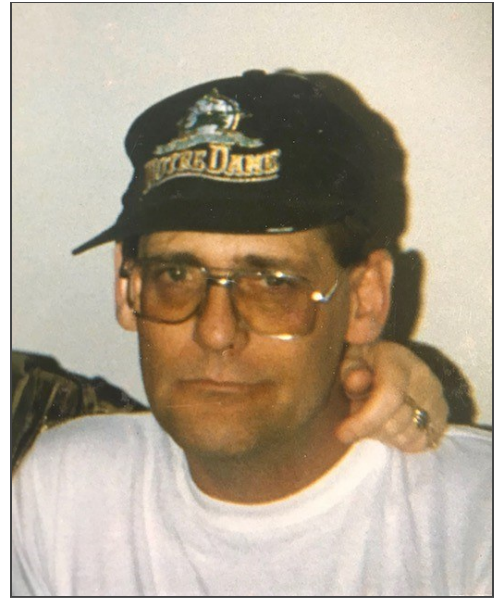


# Douglas Peter Fraser

It is with great sadness that as a family we announce the passing of Douglas Peter Fraser. Doug passed away on Tuesday, May 28th, 2019 at Foothills Hospital, with a number of family and friends by his side. Doug always lived his life exactly how he wanted to live it, but
