It is with great sadness we announce the passing of Allan Fraser at the age of 80 years after a sudden cancer diagnosis. He is lovingly remembered by his wife, Nancy, of 37 years; his children, James (Liz), Tim, Chris, Amy (Joe) Robson, Colin, Sheldon, Alana (Jarrett) Harbidge; 7 grandchildren; brother, Cecil (Pamela); stepmom, Izora Fraser; cousins, Dianne Campbell and family and Jim Fairweather.

Allan was born in Montreal, QB. Allan and his family lived in several places in the US, before settling in Symon's Valley with his grandparents James and Jamesina Fairweather. He began farming at a young age and continued that as his passion and life's work. He also had a passion for flying and sailing, and kept his private pilot's license. He was active in many organizations throughout his life, to name a few; Rockyview Gas Co-op, Hail Suppression Board, Vice Chair of the Alberta Feeder Association, Agriculture and Food Council, and most recently Chair of the Board of the Balzac United Church.
