Lew was raised and schooled in Raven and as a young man began working as a farm hand for several farming communities. He made lifelong friendships with all the families he ever worked for. Later Dad moved to Calgary where he met and married our mother, Loraine Naismith. Lew took on Loraine's three small boys as his own, and soon fathered three more children; twin daughters and a son. He worked many jobs in Calgary, and often two or three at a time. He worked for the CPR Ogden Shops Location, and his longest employment was with Consolidated Concrete for well over 30 years. Lew and Loraine retired and moved to Longview Alberta, where they spent 19 of the best years of their 64 years together. Lew's last residence was at the Sandstone Lodge in Okotoks, Alberta.
