My name is Jess, and I stand before you today not only as her son, but as the voice of my youngest sister, Baby, who is speaking from her heart all the way from the Philippines. We are gathered here today with broken hearts—to honor the life of our dearest mother, and to grieve her sudden and painful passing. She was taken from us, in a way none of us expected. But even in this moment of deep sorrow, we hold on to the beautiful life she lived—and the love she gave so fully. My sister wants to share this: "Lumaki ako na may sakit ang aming ama. Bata pa lang ako, nakita ko kung paano inalagaan ng inay si tatay—buong puso, buong tiyaga—sa loob ng mahigit dalawangampung taon. Hindi niya kami pinabayaan. Siya ang haligi ng tahanan. Siya ang nagsumikap para maitaguyod kaming magkakapatid." "Pinag-aral at pinag-tapos niya ako. Sinuportahan niya ako sa lahat ng alam niyang makakabuti para sa akin.
