She attended the legion weekly for serious games of shuffleboard with her many friends and lived life to its fullest. Until recently she was on the go wherever and whenever she could, occasionally causing her family to worry. She was always fine and could never understand "what all the fuss was about". Maxine spent the last 2.5 years with her new "buddies" living at the Silvera Westview Lodge for Seniors, where she was cared for with much love, compassion and kindness. we are for your support in her final years.
