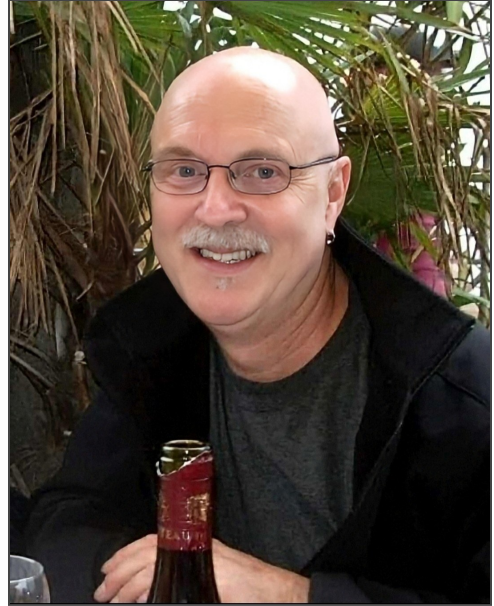


# Harry E. Bullen
