Dorian passed away peacefully in Regina, SK on Sunday, April 14, 2019 at the age of 71 years.

Dorian is survived by his loving family including his wife of 48 years, Bernice; daughter Adrienne Hassard; son Dustin (Shea) Hassard;

They had two children together as well as three grandchildren, all of whom were a source of great pride. He was a very active, social and good-natured man who enjoyed hockey, golfing, traveling, hunting, fishing, and above all spending time with family and friends. He was an
