It is with great sadness that the family of Marion Hillier announces her passing on Monday, February 22, 2021 at the age of 75.

She was a beloved daughter of the late Lena Marie and Kenneth LaPorte and will be lovingly remembered by her two children Scott (Jennifer) and Carrie (Todd). She was a proud Nana to Jessica, Tyler (Ashley), Samantha and Jordan, as well as a Great-Nana to Emma and Gavin. 'Mare' will be missed by her sisters; Sandra, Catherine, Pamela and Keni.
