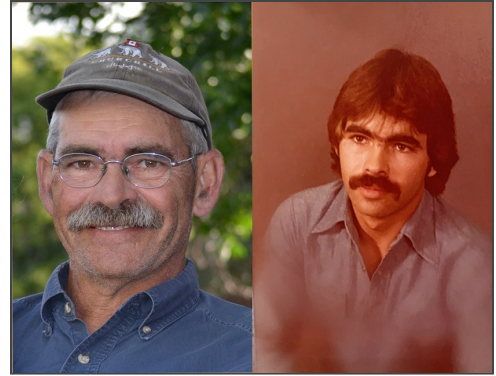


# Dana Lynn Hingston
