

Anton "Tony" Frank Hintz

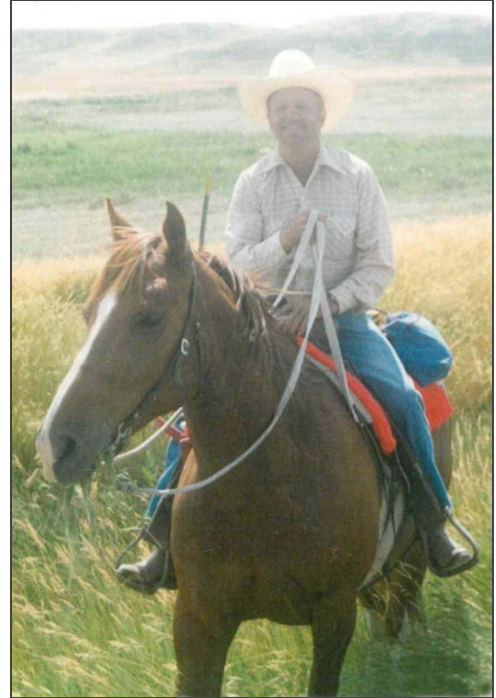
