

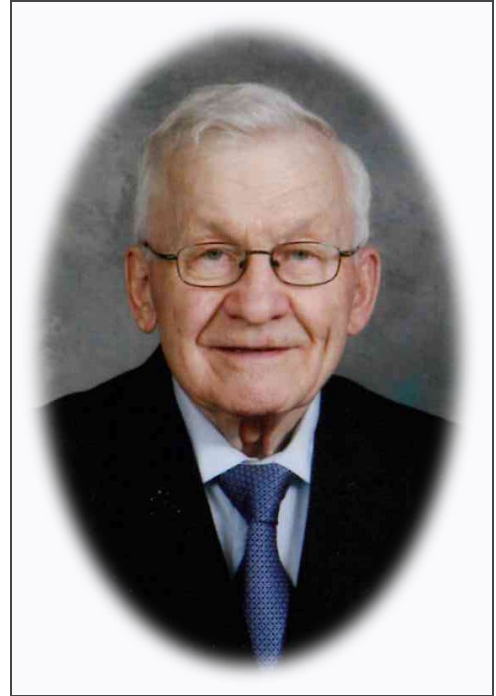
Louis Anthony Hompoth
