May 5, 1938 - June 7, 2023.

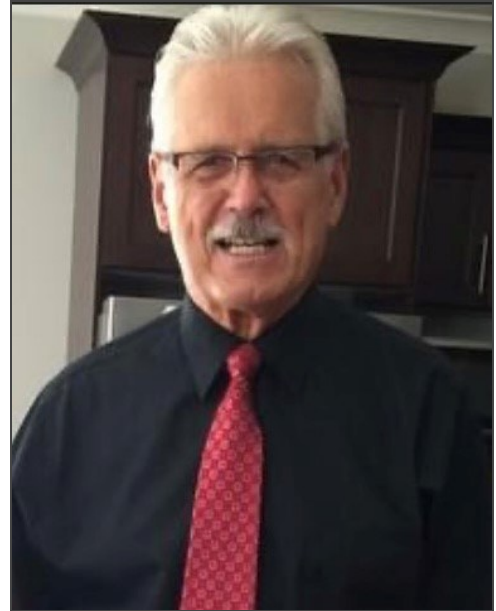
Wayne passed peacefully at home, Wednesday June 7th with his wife and children by his side.
