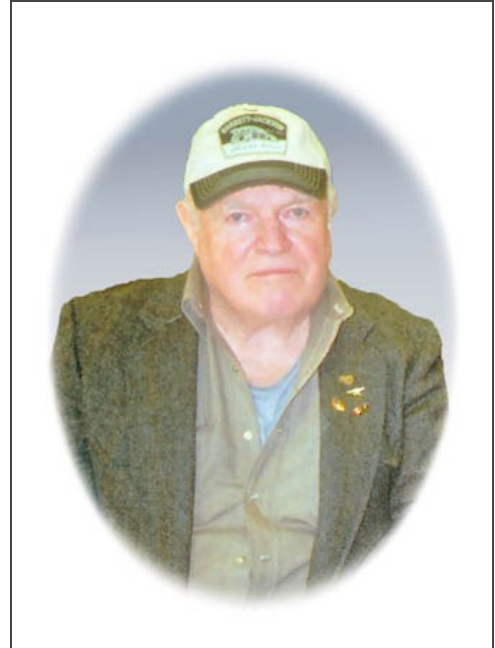


Robert "Bob" Edgar Hunter
