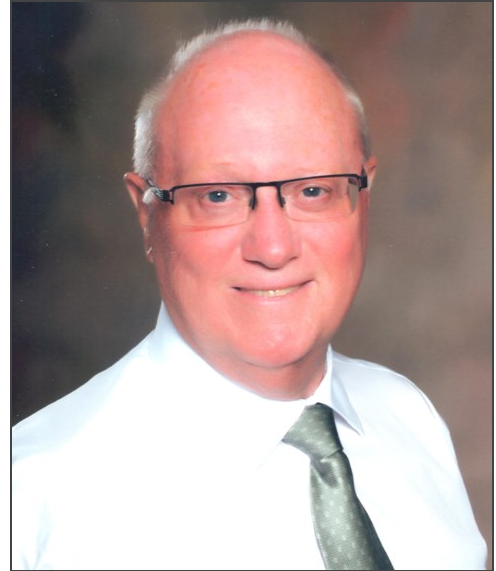


# Kenneth (Ken) James Ingram
