Born in Eastbourne, England, Isobel was the second youngest of six siblings and a joyful addition to her loving parents. Her early years in Eastbourne were filled with seaside adventures, strong friendships, and colourful stories, including the time



she famously fought off a purse-snatcher with her handbag, a testament to her courage and tenacity.

In the late 1960s, Isobel followed Alfred to Switzerland. With her characteristic warmth and humour, she quickly learned Swiss-German and wove herself into the fabric of the family and local community.
