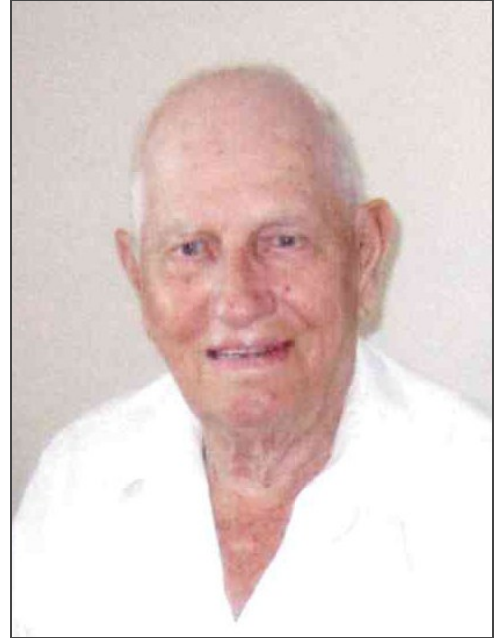


Norman Jorgensen
