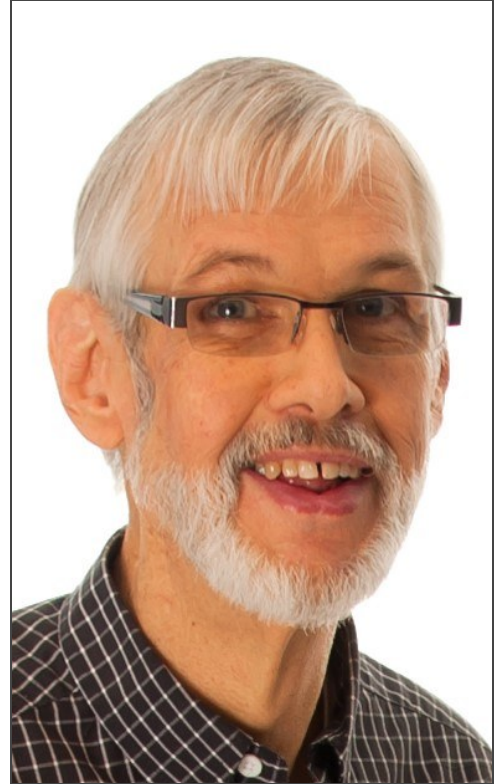


# Wayne Stephen Josefson

JUNE 17, 2019

Wayne Stephen Josefson fell asleep in the Lord with his family around him on June 17, 2019 at the age of 66 years. He will be missed by his wife Shirley; children Michelle, Suzanne (Chris Beckel), and Mark (Valérie Lemay); and his beloved grandchildren Emaleigh, William, and Andrew; extended family, friends, and colleagues.



Wayne was born in Wyoming, Rhode Island on December 25, 1952 to Raymond and Pauline Josefson. He has three brothers Jeff, Doug, and Dean. The family lived in Wyoming, Rhode Island until Wayne was six, at which point they moved to Warwick. After High School, Wayne spent one year at the University of Rhode Island studying administration and then one year in a small Bible School. That summer he went to Magog, Québec to work at a camp where he felt the Lord pushing him to learn French at Bethel, a school that would come to have an important impact on his life.

After learning French, Wayne took theological and biblical courses at Bethel which opened him to his calling as a pastor. More importantly, it was there that Wayne met the love of his life and future wife. After proposing to Shirley, they started dating and soon got married. Their first child, Michelle was born during a two-year stint as student pastor in Richmond, Québec. Shortly thereafter, Wayne - and

Shirley - accepted their first call to the full-time pastorate at the Église Évangélique Libre de Chambly, near Montréal, where they would minister for 19 years and where Suzanne and Mark were born.

During his time as pastor in Chambly, Wayne also became superintendent of the Evangelical Free Church of Québec. This allowed him to use his strong administrative drive and focus on details. It also afforded him the opportunity to travel and create some strong and lasting friendships with other members of the Free Church board. Having a very diverse skillset, Wayne found fulfillment in building relationships, preaching, teaching, administrating, and doing various building and renovation projects. However, cancer and spreading himself a little thin resulted in Wayne struggling with depression and burnout. Eventually he decided to seek a change by completing his M.Div. at Briercrest. He spent the subsequent years in Québec back at Bethel as registrar and administrator investing in another generation of francophone young people seeking to learn about God.

His final chapter of ministry was spent serving the Evangelical Free Church of Regina close to his cherished grandchildren. Despite his increasing health issues, it brought him great joy to be part of the E-Free Church again and to invest in significant relationships.

Wayne was granted his desire not to retire but to serve to the end of his life.

"Christ Himself is the builder of His spiritual temple, and He has built it on the mountains of His unchangeable affection, His omnipotent grace, and His infallible truthfulness. But as it was in Solomon's temple, so in this: The materials need to be prepared. There are the cedars of Lebanon, but they are not framed for the building; they are not cut down and shaped and made into those planks of cedar whose fragrant beauty will make glad the courts of the Lord's house in paradise. There are also the rough stones still in the quarry, which must be hewn out and squared.

All this is Christ's own work. Each individual believer is being prepared and polished and made ready for his place in the temple; but Christ's own hand performs the preparation-work. Afflictions cannot sanctify, except when they are used by Him to fulfill His purpose. Our prayers and efforts cannot make us ready for heaven, apart from the hand of Jesus, who fashions our hearts correctly.
