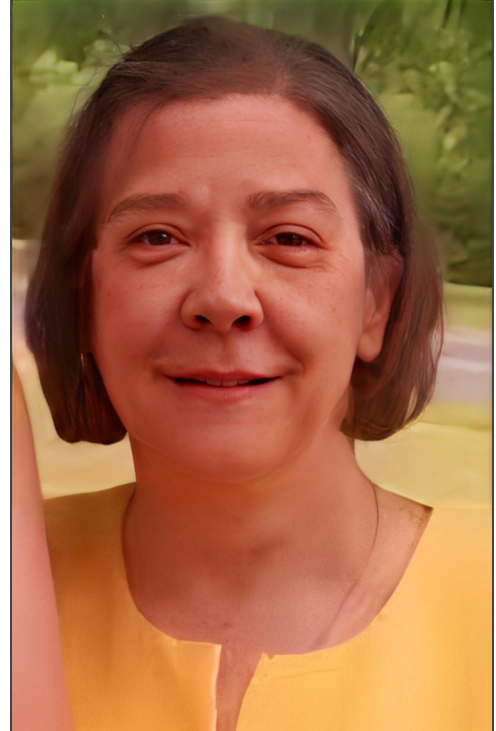


# Marilyn Margaret Karst
