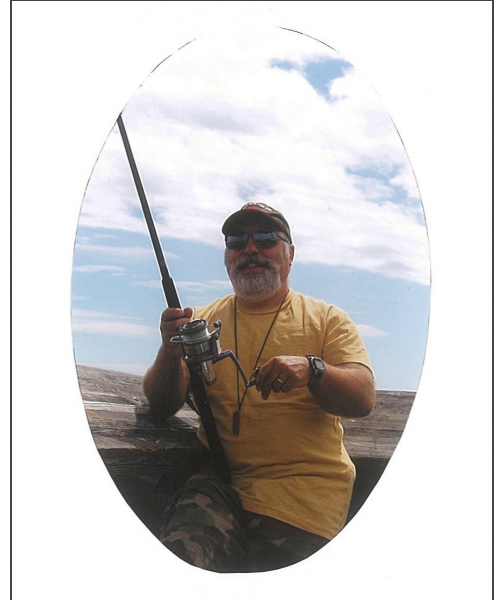


Steven (Steve) Andrew Harvey Kaszas
