**November 13, 1932 - November 27, 2025**

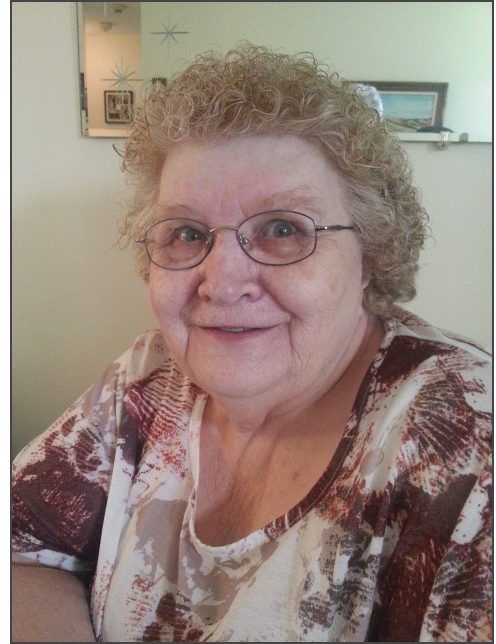
With deep love and gratitude for her long life, we announce that Katherine Rose Wilcox, affectionately known as Kay, went to Heaven
