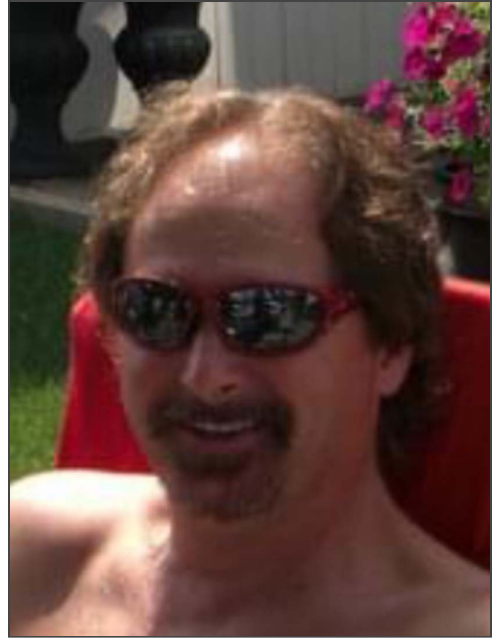


Grant Peter Kluge
