Dad was a truck driver, many years for Consolidated/Inland Cemet and retirement didn't sit too well with him, so he worked for

Co-Op Gas Bar, till a fall brought that job to a halt. So he continued his life enjoying his kids and grandkids who he loved more than life itself.

Dad's health was starting to cause him problems and after this past year, he visted the hospital many times and last week he decieded his days were time to come to an end and his agony came to an end on Thursday, January 13, 2022, with his family gathered around him and family face timed to say goodbye.
