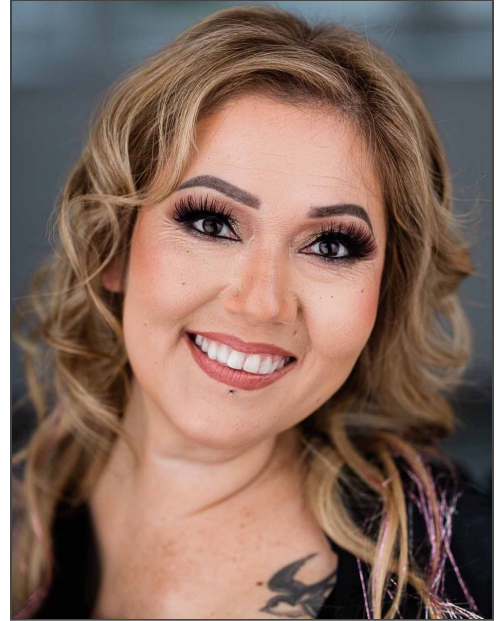


Vicki Leona Kwong
