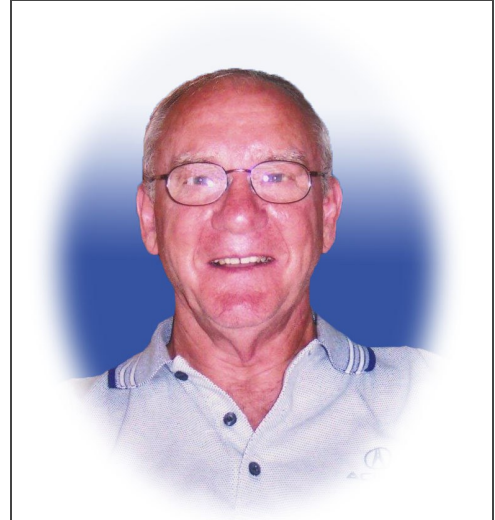


# Floyd "Flick" Landry

Floyd (Flick) Landry passed away on Wednesday, October 29, 2014 after a courageous battle with cancer at the age of 80 years. He is lovingly remembered by his wife, Peggy; children, Brian (Debby) Landry, Bruce Landry, Karen (Darcy) Ternes, Scott (Kelly) Landry; grandchildren, Meghan Landry (Brian), Amy and Jenna Ternes (Karen), Cameron Landry (Scott); his siblings, Ward Landry (Palm Desert ,CA), Donalda (Ron) Hughes (Mill River, P.E.I), and Richard Landry (Georgetown, P.E.I).
