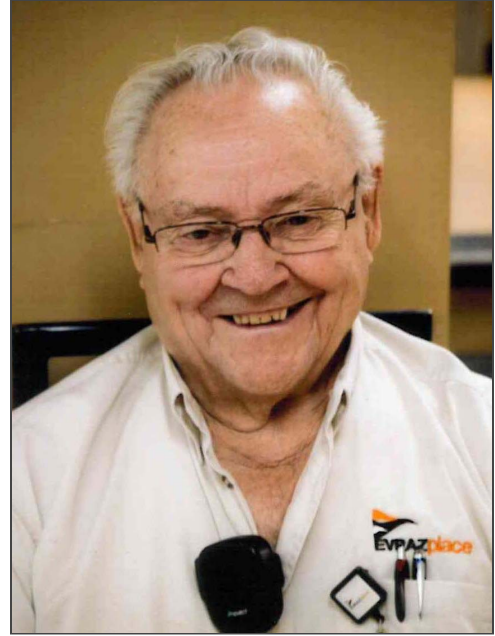


Joe Lange
