Son of Henry and Wray Leier of Unity, Sask.

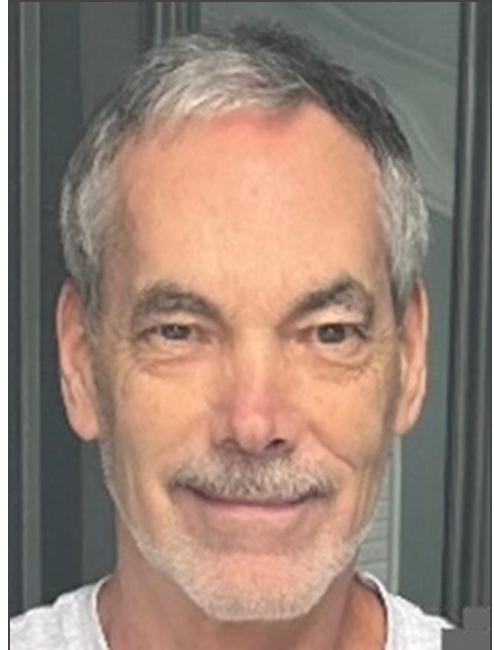
Lorne passed away unexpectedly on Sunday June 9th at the Royal Columbia Hospital in New Westminister BC.
