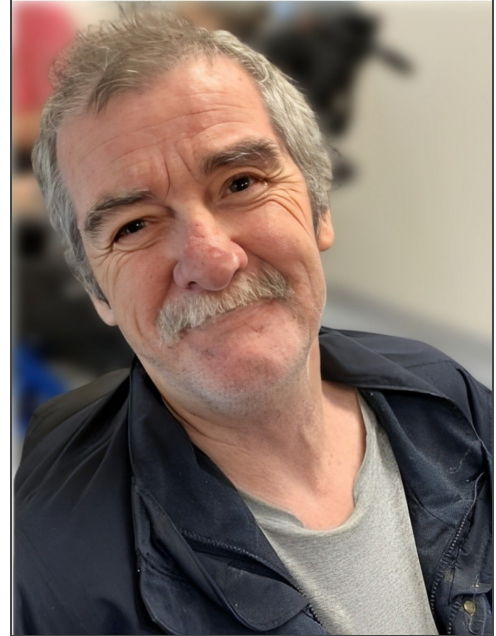


Joseph Anthony LeStrange
