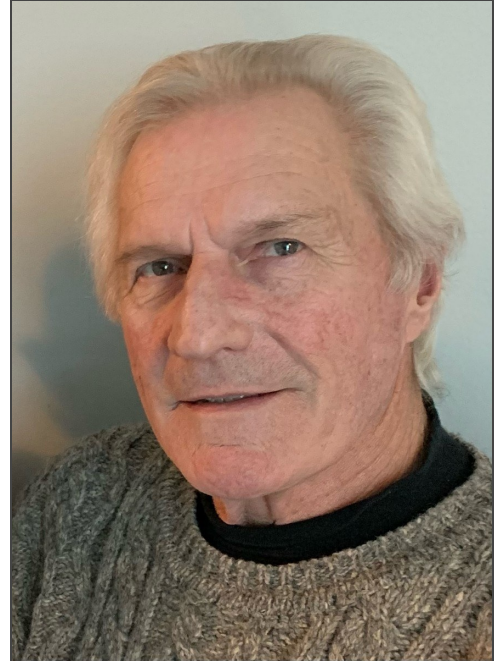


Donald Philip Newton Link
