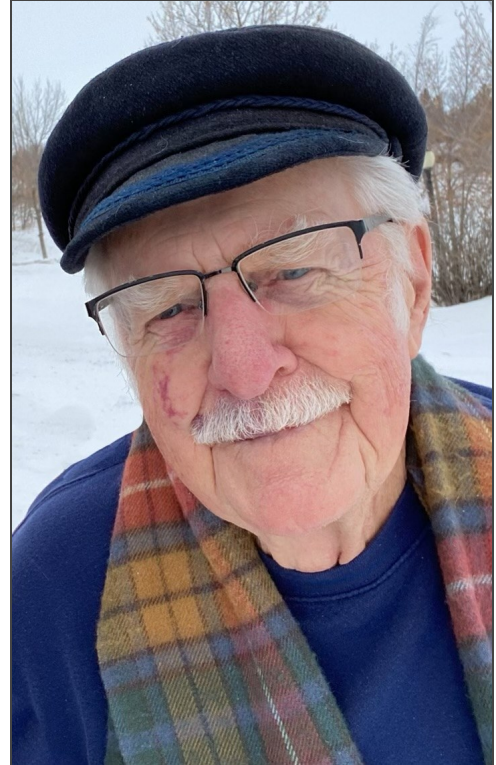


# Clarence MacCormack
